

**ONE-DAY MARRIAGE OFFICIANT LICENSE**  
Domestic Relations Law, Chapter 14, Article 3, Section 11-D

Beginning on March 28, 2023, any person eighteen years old and over can solemnize a Marriage Ceremony in New York State after obtaining a One-Day Marriage Officiant License from the Office of the Town Clerk where the couple is applying for the Marriage License. A One-Day Marriage Officiant does not have to be a resident of New York State.

The fee for issuing a One-Day Marriage Officiant License is \$25 payable by check or money order made out to “The Clifton Park Town Clerk” or by cash or credit card (in-person applications only).

Applicants do not need to apply in person. Mail in completed **notarized** original One-Day Marriage Officiant License. Include a copy of identification such as driver’s license or passport, and \$25 fee to Clifton Park Town Clerk, #1 Town Hall Plaza, Clifton Park, NY 12065. The Town Clerk’s Office will then complete the License Granted section and file with the Marriage License. An application for a One-Day Marriage Officiant License may only be submitted **after** the parties-to-be-married have obtained their Marriage License from the same office and before the ceremony.

A One-Day Marriage Officiant License is only valid for the parties-to-be-married as stated on the application and expires upon the completion of such solemnization or the expiration of the related Marriage License, whichever is earlier. An application for a One-Day Marriage Officiant License may only be submitted **after** the parties-to-be-married have obtained their Marriage License.

A One-Day Marriage Officiant has the authority to solemnize a marriage anywhere in New York State, during the time limit the couple’s marriage license is in effect. The officiant must ensure that the marriage license information is accurate and must complete the officiant information, bottom Section #’s 26-31, on the original marriage license. Once reviewed and completed, the officiant must file the completed marriage license with the Town Clerk within five days of the ceremony.
